## Where does Community Van operate?

Community Van service areas include Shoreline, Lake Forest Park, Kenmore, Bothell, Woodinville, Kirkland, Redmond, Sammamish, Snoqualmie Valley, Vashon, Skyway, Tukwila, Algona, and Pacific. This means you can attend driver training or pick up your van in these areas, **but that doesn't mean that you can only drive within these areas.**

You're welcome to use Community Van outside of these service areas as long as you stay within 2 hours of your point of origin. Wherever you pick up your Community Van is also where it returns when your trip ends.

**The price is the same as a standard King County Metro bus fare**, but you get to ride with loved ones, neighbors, teammates, or other community members



**Youth ages 18 and under ride for free**



**If you become a Volunteer Driver, Community Van covers your fare while driving**



**King County Metro covers the price** of gas, insurance, tolls, and a Discover Pass



**Our 6-passenger Community Vans are wheelchair accessible**, and all volunteer drivers receive training in loading and securing wheelchairs



By sharing your ride, you help **reduce pollution and protect the environment**

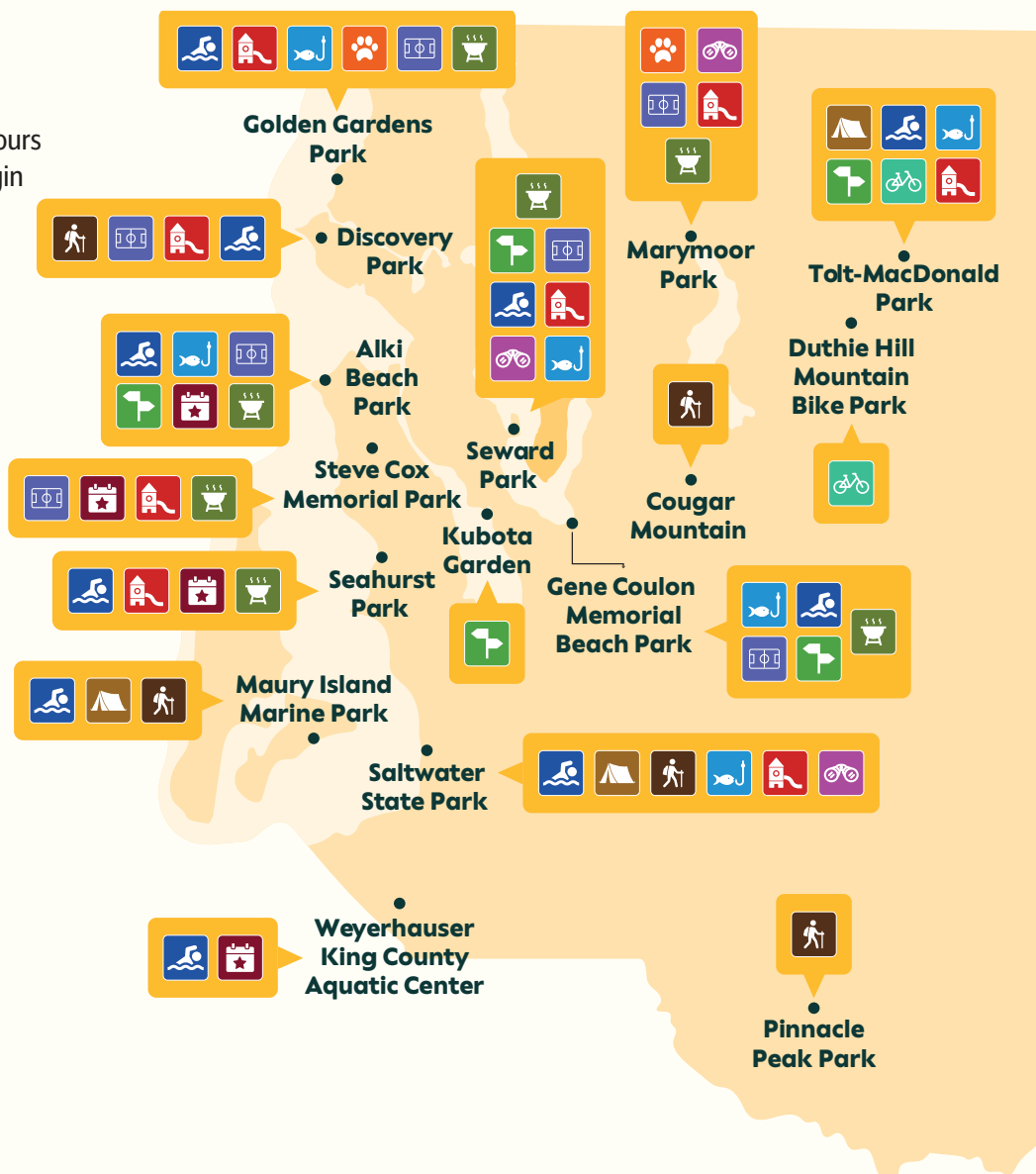

## Where can I go with Community Van?

As long as your trip is no more than 2 hours travel time away from your point of origin and doesn't last overnight, you can use Community Van to get there! Go to [kingcounty.gov/FunFinder](http://kingcounty.gov/FunFinder) for even more places to visit.

## How do I become a Community Van volunteer driver?

- 1. Review and confirm your eligibility** as a driver on the Community Van website.
- 2. Submit your driver application** and indicate the service area where you'd like to attend training. Your area's Community Transportation Coordinator will reach out to you to schedule driver training.
- 3. Complete an in-person driver training** and online certification.
